# **Nursery**

#### **Green Room**

In Green Room we have been looking carefully at some of our core books, such as 'Where's Spot?' and 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt.' We had fun hiding in boxes and looking for Spot around the classroom. We have been exploring mud, grass, water and now snow linking to the 'Going on a Bear Hunt' Story. The children now know these stories really well.

# Reception




# Year 1

In Geography we explored different types of weather patterns in the United Kingdom. We recorded weather reports and used globes to find the equator and hot and cold countries in the world.







## Year 2


