## **Nursery**

#### **Green Room**

This term we have been learning about transport. 'The Train Ride' and 'Maisy's Bus' are some of the transport books that we have been reading. The children enjoyed using the role play area pretending to go on a train and on a bus. They spoke about who they could see on their journey. They also enjoyed lots of different activities such as marking making, counting, and painting pictures of buses and trains.







#### **Red and Blue Room**

We have been learning about People Who Help Us. We have been focusing on doctors, police and firefighters. We even had a visit from the police. The children have loved using the role play area to explore the roles of people who help us.







# Reception

Our topic this term is Transport. We have thought about travelling on different modes of transport and who we would take with us. Children have used their increasing phonic knowledge to write sentences about who they would travel with. We ended the term with an Educational Visit to London City Airport.







#### Year 1

## **Crash Landing**

In Year 1, children are learning about Space. At the start of the topic the Year 1 children arrived at school to find that there had been a mysterious crash landing in the school. Children investigated the objects left at the crash landing site and used these objects as clues to discover that the astronaut Helen Sharman was missing! We created an incident report and made a missing poster for Helen Sharman.



#### The Science Museum

In January the children in Year 1 went to visit the Science Museum. This visit supported the children in developing their understanding of space. The children were very excited to take the District Line all the way to South Kensington. During their visit, the children went to the Exploring Space area where they were able to see the different planets in 3D motion and look at real life spaceships. The children were able to see a piece of the moon and spacesuits worn by real astronauts. A shocking discovery found by one of the children was seeing Helen Sharman's spacesuit in the museum. This is because she was an astronaut who was known to the children as she crash landed at Altmore Infant School in the Sensory Garden.





Year 2

#### Music

In Year 2, we have been lucky enough to have Miss Juritz from Newham Music come in and teach Music lessons. We began by learning all about beats and rhythms and we have even created some of our own using our body parts. We then moved on to learning about pitch and had a go at using our voices to create high and low pitches. Next term, we will use our knowledge of rhythms, beat and pitch and have the opportunity to learn how to play a glockenspiel.





#### **Safer Internet Day**


